The AGM will be followed by an address from Mr Dominic Teakle, CEO of the PCYC.

Celebrating its 80th anniversary this year and with more than 100,000 members, the partnership between the community and the NSW Police Force has built up to be Australia's pre-eminent youth organisation working with Police and community to empower young people to reach their potential.

Dominic will discuss some the challenges and successes of the organisation as it continues to implement its current strategic plan to:

- provide a safe environment for youth
- provide programs and activities which reduce youth crime and engage youth in the community
- engage youth on their own terms
- deliver programs to achieve their mission in an ethical and environmentally and commercially sustainable way
- have staff and volunteers who want to belong to PCYC and who are motivated to serve youth

PCYC is a partnership that was forged within the community via Rotary to provide young people with a safe and positive alternative and that vision has now grown to the extent that PCYC NSW now operates in 64 clubs and centres across NSW, with a major refurbishment and expansion plan currently underway.

PCYC's programs and staff are intimately involved in educational programs and throughout the legal system. Every police program has to have three parts: an educational component, activities and a nutritional component. About 1500 'at risk' young people are involved in such programs around the state at any one time.

PCYC NSW is also a Registered Training Organisation that provides many qualifications including Diplomas and Certificates.
