"THE CONFERENCE"

[A review and update on everything you need to know about education and the law].

We invite you to prepare a proposal to present at the 2019 conference.

In 2019, the Victorian chapter is holding "The Conference". This conference is designed to update you on everything you need to know about education law. "The Conference" will explore recent developments, eg religious instructions, disability in education, special education settings, gender issues in schools as well as recent practices and updates about the law in education settings. We aim to provide delegates with the opportunity to share the issues, struggles, successes and insights into how the law impacts on the delivery and outcomes for education.

We invite teachers, university academics, lawyers in both private practice and the public sector, administrators, those involved in policy formation, union officers and representatives of employer bodies to come together to share ideas about how the law impacts on the delivery of, and outcomes from, education.

This year's conference is focusing on collaboration and sharing of experiences and information in a collegial setting. We are particularly interested in workshops, collaborations and in diverse and unique ideas for engaging participants in discussion so if you have ideas for how to present subjects differently – we are all ears please bring forward your concepts so that we can determine whether they will fit into the conference format.

Proposals can be submitted for any of the following categories:

1. **A non-refereed paper** (full text of paper to be provided to Secretariat by 25 September 2019). Each presentation is allocated 35 minutes for delivery with 10 minutes allocated for questions and answers.
2. **A refereed conference paper** (full text of paper for peer review by 19 July 2019). Each presentation is allocated 35 minutes for delivery with 10 minutes allocated for questions and discussion.
3. **A workshop or panel proposal on any topic of interest.** Concept proposals should explain what aspects of the conference theme the presentation will address, the format of the workshop and a brief summary of the content. For this option written papers are not

required to be provided for the conference delegates. A workshop/panel is typically allocated 50 minutes which includes questions and discussion.

Please note that PowerPoint presentations are not mandated as part of your paper/presentation. However, the paper being presented is requested so that it can be provided to the conference delegates

All presentation proposals should be between 250-500 words and include:

- Title of paper or presentation
- An overview of the content
This information will be used as content within our promotional conference brochure
- Relevance to the conference theme
- An indication of which of the three options above is applicable
- Name, address and title of author(s)/presenter(s)
- Contact details and brief biography (50 words)

Outlines for all proposals must be received by Jo Spencer via email to anzela@anzela.edu.au (or jo.spencer@oer.tas.gov.au) by 5pm 29 March 2019. The organising committee will advise all those submitting proposals of acceptance or otherwise by the end of April 2019. It is anticipated that a conference program will be drafted by the end of May 2019 ready for conference promotion. (*Presenters whose proposals are accepted, attend the conference at the ANZELA member's early bird rate*).
